With the new year, the library is kicking off our expansion project. It will create a community gathering place, additional meeting rooms, room for a more extensive collection, and

separate adult, teen, and children's areas.

For the last 25 years, the library has served you funded by \$0.4349 per thousand property tax, grants, and donations, which means you never pay an additional fee when you step into the library; all of our events, programs, and meeting rooms are free to the public.

The proposed expansion will increase the library space from 6,000 to 18,000 square feet. We are currently applying for grants, and we've received several large donations for the project. We are presenting a construction bond in the May 2025 election.
